## **Cawthorne 176 for six, Higham 114 (Section "A")**

On a slow true wicket which offered little help to the bowlers early on, Cawthorne romped away to a great start, thanks to openers Des O'Keefe (66) and Trevor Littlewood (42).

When these two were parted, Malcolm Turner hit 36 and when the overs expired, Cawthorne had totalled 176 for the loss of six wickets. Ogley and Lockwood took three wickets each for 56 and 58 runs respectively.

Higham were soon in trouble. Frank Kilburn caused most of it with a five for 41 performance. He was supported by Peter Broadhead (three for 54) and although Harris (39) and Heppenstall (24) batted soundly, the visitors were all out 114. Fossett (17) and Brooks (13) were Higham's other double figure scorers.

## **Cawthorne 127 for four, Denby 128 for three (Section "C")**

Cawthorne put down too many catches to give their bowlers any chance of containing Denby.

Denby, wanting 128 runs to win, got there with seven wickets in hand. P. Bentley (62) led the way. He punished anything that was off a length and along with G. Bever's 35 not out — he survived one strong appeal — saw the target reached inside 23 overs.

For once, Cawthorne's batting came off. They made 127 for the loss of just four wickets, Geoff Dry's stylish 56 not out being the highlight. David Rose made 23 and John Armistead, playing his first game of the season was 19 not out. Gaunt claimed two for 34.

## **Cawthorne 67 for six, Dodworth 71 for three (Junior Section)**

Replying to Cawthorne's opening total of 67 for the loss of six wickets, Dodworth were given a good start by Askey who had made 26 when he was run out. However, Cant demonstrated how to perform in limited over matches with a well-struck 29 not out which saw victory reached with seven wickets in hand.

Cawthorne, who introduced four new players, were thankful to Smith (20), Pickersgill (11) and Harris (11 not out) for their total. Waddington was Dodworth's most successful bowler with four for 27.
