

Stars play cricket for charity

A star-studded charity match at Cawthorne on Sunday raised a total of £170.

The main attraction was actor Stan Richards, Emmerdale Farm's Seth Armstrong, making a guest appearance for Cawthorne's opponents, Naylor Bros.

He stayed at the crease just long enough to delight the large crowd before dashing off to Grimsby to appear in cabaret.

But the home side had their share of big names, with Sheffield and England rugby union star Alan Old (brother of Yorkshire's Chris Old) leading their batting.

In fact, guest players on both sides meant that the teams bore little resemblance

to either Cawthorne or Naylor Bros.

Naylor's 183 for 7 came from Geoff Heywood's 51, Barry Robertshaw's 35, Steven Peaker's 29 not out, John Peaker's 16, David Rose's 15, Ian Chappell's 13 and Steve Lawrence's 11.

Of Cawthorne's eight bowlers, Tony Barker took 2 for 18 and Brian Jessop 2 for 33.

Cawthorne's reply was spirited, though relying mainly on Alan Old. He made 63 and was well supported by Howard Yates (16), Geoff Dry (15), Stuart Kilner (14), Ian Graham (14), David Gill (13) and Geoff Gill (12).

Steve Lawrence took 2 for 18 and Ian Chappell 2 for 27.

Naylor Bros duly took the Fred Jones Trophy for the first time - winning by 18 runs - though it was achieved through the services of a number of Middlesbrough League players.

The charity takings for the day amounted to £170, which is to be shared between the James Dalton Appeal Fund and the hospital broadcasting service, NACB Radio Barnaby.

£20 came from entrance tickets, £80 from donations, £50 from the sale of 100 beer and soft drinks. The collection for Geoff Heywood's £1000 goal was £100.
